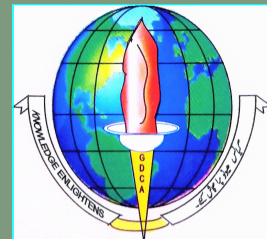

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### Vision

### College Profile

The Government Degree College Anantnag, is a premier educational institution of South Kashmir. It was established in 1950 as an intermediate college in the heart of Anantnag town. Later, it was shifted to its present location which had been a rest house of the Maharaja.

The college has flourished and distinguished itself as one of the leading higher educational institutions of the country under the able guidance of various educationists, academicians and administrators. Since its inception the college has been producing a large human capital that has been serving the society in various capacities. The availability of quality teaching-learning atmosphere with allied facilities was recognized by the national autonomous accreditation body NAAC Bangaluru, in the year 2012 and was reaccruited with grade “A” [CGPA 3.03]. In recognition of its huge potential the college has been granted “College with Potential for Excellence (CPE)” status by the University Grants Commission (UGC) in the year 2016. The college is affiliated to the University of Kashmir and is recognized under section 2(F) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956.



### 2.1 Programmes offered by the college

The college offers the following eight Programmes to the students at Under-Graduate level. The duration of each of the Programmes shall extend over **6** semesters (three academic Years); each semester to be of at least **16** weeks with **22/24/28** credits in a semester and **140** credits in **3** years for a General Programme and a total of **148** Credits for an Hon's Programme.

### 2.2 Eligibility for Admission

Subject to the policy laid down by the affiliating university, admission to first semester of **B.A./B.Sc. (General)/Hon's Programmes: B.A. English/B.Com/BBA/BCA/BMMMC/B.Sc. IT** shall be open to a candidate who has passed 12th class examination under 10+2 pattern from JKBOSE or equivalent and fulfils the conditions of eligibility as laid down for each programme. The candidates belonging to Open and Reserved Categories must have obtained minimum marks in the Higher Secondary Part II (10+2 Pattern) examination as shown below for each Programme.

### 2.3. Mode of Admission

- The admission to **1<sup>st</sup>** Semester of **B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. (General)/** shall be made as per the admission policy of the affiliating University.
- The admission to **1<sup>st</sup>** Semester of **Hon's Programmes: B.A English/BBA/BCA/B.Sc. IT/ BMMMC** and the combinations with **Social Work & Clinical Bio-Chemistry** as one of the core courses/subjects, shall be based on the merit obtained in the **10+2** level examination; *while preference shall be given to the candidates who fall within the catchment area of the college.*
- The intake for each of the programmes offered, is fixed by the University of Kashmir, with a provision for selection of candidates from reserved categories as per the reservation policy of the University/Government of Jammu & Kashmir.
- Proviso**-Provided that where no eligible candidate applies under particular category/categories for any Programme the seats shall be filled up from the open merit category in order of merit.
- Subject to eligibility conditions admission to all the courses shall be open to the residents of J&K. However, the non-local candidates, whose parents are serving in the Central or J&K Services/Public Undertakings/Corporations and posted within jurisdiction of Jammu & Kashmir, shall also be entitled to seek admission.
- Proviso**-Provided that the colleges can admit up to **10%** Non-JK residents, not covered under the sub-clause (C) above, including the Foreign Nationals.

### 2.4 Admission Procedure

A Student desirous of seeking admission in any of the General Programmes offered by the college shall have to

- ◆ Submit Registration/Admission Form online through the Kashmir University website [www.kashmiruniversity.net](http://www.kashmiruniversity.net).
- ◆ The application forms shall be generated on the basis of J&K BOSE **Registration Number**, in case of non availability of Registration Number on the University 'Website' he/she shall have to visit the University Information Centre of the College, along with all Original Certificates where he/she intends to seek admission.
- ◆ The candidate/s whose result is awaited shall be eligible to apply for provisional admission on production of an undertaking & shall be required to pay a non-refundable fee of **Rs.500/-** in lieu of admission fee. *For programmes/courses with **limited intake capacity** such candidates, however, can be considered for admission, only in case there are any vacancies left after exhausting the list of otherwise eligible candidates.*
- ◆ Approach the Admission Committee/ Counseling Cell for **Course/Subject Combination (2.8)**, with hard copy of the Admission Form (2 copies of 1st Page) along with following documents in original &/ photocopies for verification &/submission.
  - ◆ Original Provisional/Discharge/ Transfer/School Leaving cum Character Certificate, issued by the institution, last attended,
  - ◆ Two self attested copies of DoB Certificate issued by the JKBOSE/any other recognized board,
  - ◆ Two self attested copies of 12th class Marks Certificate,
  - ◆ **Two self attested copies of address proof,**
  - ◆ Two self attested copies of Category

Certificate (if admission sought under reserved category),

- ◆ Original migration certificate (if the candidate has passed the qualifying examination from the board other than JKBOSE),
- ◆ Original & photocopy of Disability Certificate/Death Certificate of parent (applicable to physically challenged & orphan candidates for examination fee & **Degree Certificate fee waiver**),
- ◆ One latest passport size photograph for I-Card/Smart Card.
- ◆ Get the course/subject combination assigned from the IT & SS section,
- ◆ After thoroughly checking your subject combination, deposit the university fee by way of credit card/debit card/net-banking or at any J&K Bank branch via a single challan generated online.  
*Physically challenged & Orphan students are exempted from payment of examination fee & **Degree Certificate fee**. They should approach the help desk before payment of fee.*
- ◆ Pay the college component of the fee using your debit/credit card/**bank challan** against proper receipt & submit the hard copy of the Admission Form along with all the enclosures in the admission section.

For admission to Hon's Programmes: **B.A English/BBA/BCA/B.Sc. IT/BMMMC** and the combinations with **Social Work & Clinical Bio-Chemistry** as one of the core courses/ subjects the aspirants have to submit pre-admission form in the Admission Section. The selected candidates have to follow the above procedure for completing the admission formalities.

### 2.5 Eligibility for Course Choice

- ◆ Except in the case of **Computer Applications, Geology, Geography**, no candidate for the **B.Sc. Semester-I** examination shall take up any course unless (s)he had taken up same courses in Higher Secondary Part-II of 10+2 pattern or an equivalent examination, provided that a candidate having passed Higher Secondary Part II Examination with:-
  - ◆ Biology/Biotechnology as a course at 10+2 level will be eligible to take up **Botany, Zoology, Biotechnology** or a combination of any of these.
  - ◆ Mathematics and Physics as courses will be eligible to take up **Electronics**.
- ◆ No-candidate shall take up **Mathematics** for **B.A./B.Sc. Semester-I** unless he/she has qualified the 12th class examination with **Mathematics**.
- ◆ No candidate can opt for **Physics/Electronics** without **Mathematics**.
- ◆ A candidate having passed the 12th class examination with the group of courses not offered by the college as such but related to the courses offered by the college may opt for such science courses.
- ◆ A candidate who has passed the 12th class examination with a particular group of **Arts** courses may be allowed to **change** his/her courses at the time of admission to **1<sup>st</sup> Semester** of the **B.A. Programme**.
- ◆ A student who has passed the 12<sup>th</sup> class examination with **Science/Home Science** courses may be allowed to take Arts/Commerce Courses in the **1<sup>st</sup> Semester** of the **B.A./B.Com. Programme**.
- ◆ A student who has passed the 12th class examination with Commerce group of courses may be allowed to take up Arts courses in the **1<sup>st</sup> Semester** of the **B.A. Programme**.
- ◆ A candidate for the B.A./B.Sc. (General)/Hon's Programmes: B.A. English/B.Com./BBA/BCA/B.Sc. IT/BMMMC Semester-II, III, IV, V and VI **Examinations** shall have to opt for the Discipline Specific Core (DSC) and Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses, as per the applicable scheme, with which he/she passed B.A./B.Sc. (General)/ Hon's Programmes: B.A. English/B. Com./BBA/BCA/B.Sc. IT/BMMMC **Semester-I** Examination in all the courses opted at the point of admission to **Semester – I**.

◆ #The candidates as would have passed their 10+2 examination without Mathematics/Computer related subjects shall have to compulsorily opt Mathematics as a Generic Elective in all 1st four semesters for BCA Hon's Programme.

### 2.6 Outlines of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

A UG Programme consists of following different types of courses:

1. **DSC: Discipline Specific Core:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement
2. **General English & MIL\*:** 2 courses each for B.A. Programme only.
3. **Elective Course:**
  - a. **DSE: Discipline Specific Elective:** Electives related to Discipline Specific Core Courses.
  - b. **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work. It may be given in lieu of a DSE paper.
  - c. **GE#: Generic Elective:** An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called Generic Elective.
4. **AEC: Ability Enhancement Courses:**
  - a. **AECC: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course:** English Communication Skills (ECS), Environmental Studies (EVS)
  - b. **SEC: Skill Enhancement Course:** These courses shall be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and shall contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work.
5. **Practicals/Tutorials:** One each with every Core and Discipline Specific/Generic Elective Course.
6. **Additional English:** 2 credit course for General Programme.

\***MIL: Modern Indian Languages** (Urdu/Kashmiri/Hindi/Persian/Arabic)

#A Core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as a Generic Elective for other disciplines/subjects and vice versa.

### 3.1 Eligibility criteria for appearing in Examination\*

A regular candidate intending to appear in the Examination of the programme shall be required to satisfy the following conditions:-

- a. Has been on the rolls of the college for one academic semester preceding the examination with at least 75% of attendance in Theory, Tutorial/Practical training/field work prescribed in the syllabi for the semester,
- b. Has exhibited good moral conduct in the college,
- c. Has submitted his examination form along with the requisite fee;
- d. Students who after having undergone a regular Programme of study and having completed all conditions of eligibility for appearing in a Semester End Examination in the Course/s including minimum attendance requirement and having either failed to pass the Semester End Examination in the Course/s or been unable to appear in the examination in the Course/s will be eligible to appear as Late College students in the examination by submitting application in the prescribed form along with prescribed fees to reach the Controller of Examinations, within the dates fixed for this purpose.

Any candidate, who falls short of attendance in a course in a semester, shall not be eligible to appear in that particular course(s) in which he/she is falling short of attendance. *However, he/she shall be entitled to appear in the course(s) in the next session after attending the deficit number of classes in the next session.*

The Principal shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study if he/she remains absent continuously for a period of 20 days without his permission. However, if satisfied that the absence of the student was beyond the control of the student, he can re-admit such a student to the programme only once, on payment of a re-admission fee equal to

50% of the normal admission fee and an undertaking from the candidate and his/her parent/guardian to the effect that such practice shall not be repeated.

### 3.2 Concessions

A candidate who participates in any of the accepted co/extra-curricular activities may for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance incurred by him/her on account of such participation be treated as present on all the working days of his/ her absence on such account subject to a maximum prescribed limit in an academic semester.

### 3.3 Condonation

Where any candidate falls short of attendance in any semester, the Principal/Vice-Chancellor if satisfied may condone such shortfall to a maximum permissible limit after sufficient cause is shown by the candidate in writing.

### 3.4 Promotion

Subject to the provisions contained in the statutes and regulations promotion shall be open to:-

- i. A candidate from one semester to next higher semester in case he/she has been admitted to previous semester, under rules.
- ii. A candidate from 4<sup>th</sup> semester to 5<sup>th</sup> semester in case he/she has not a backlog of more than 50% credits of study in 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> semesters exclusive of any awaited re-evaluation result.
- iii. A candidate who has not completed the requirement of a particular semester shall not be allowed to sit in the examination of that semester. However, he/she shall not be debarred from joining the next semester, if otherwise eligible under rules. He/she can complete the missing semester (s) in subsequent session (s) as and when possible.

*\*The criteria are subject to change by the University of Kashmir !*

### 3.5 Examination Pattern

There shall be two different patterns of Question Papers for odd & even semesters.

#### 3.5.1. Question Paper Pattern for Odd Semester End Examinations:

For Odd Semesters the Question Paper shall be of descriptive type & shall comprise three Sections, as under:

**Section A:** This Section shall have Eight Short Answer type Questions, two from each unit, for a 6, 4 or 3 Credit Course to be answered in up to a maximum of 20 words each, in the space provided for the purpose. For a 2 Credit Course the section shall comprise only Four Questions representing the two units.

**Section B:** This Section shall have Four Medium Answer type Questions; one from each unit, for a 6, 4 or 3 Credit Course with Internal Choice, to be answered in not more than 150 words each. For a 2 Credit Course the section shall comprise only Two Questions representing the two units.

**Section C:** This Section shall have One Question from each Unit and the students shall have to attempt any Two Long Answer Questions for a 3 or more Credit Course and any one Question for a 2 Credit Course, to be answered in not more than 300 words.

#### 3.5.2. Question Paper Pattern for Even Semester End Examinations:

### 3.6 Regulations:

- ♦ A candidate who appears and passes in the Practical Examination of a course but fails to qualify in the theory course shall be exempted from appearing in the practical examination of the course subsequently.
- ♦ A candidate who passes in any component of a course/s in a Semester End Examination shall be exempted from appearing in such a component of course/s in the subsequent examination (s) under the re-appear category.
- ♦ A candidate may appear in the exempted course/s, for division improvement. The result shall be declared only if he/she improves upon his/her earlier performance.
- ♦ Only a single Transcript, indicating SGPA's & the CGPA & the final Degree Certificate shall be issued to the student only after completion of the Programme of study.

#### 4.1 Physical Education

The college has a well established Physical Education Department to cater to the sports & athletic aspirations of its students. The department explores and nourishes the sports talent of the students and after proper training and coaching exposes them to high level competitions. The department also helps talented sportspersons to participate in J&K and national level events.

The college has an ambitious plan to have a separate state of the art physical education block with all the latest sports equipment, in near future.

#### 4.2 Subject Tours/Field Visits

In addition to normal curricular activities the departments of Zoology, Botany, Environment Science, Chemistry, Biotechnology, Seed Technology, Physics, Electronics, EEM, Geology, Geography, Computer Applications, Information Technology, Commerce, Business Administration, History, Education, Economics and others conduct subject tours/field works for the students as part of their practical training. B.Com./BBA/BCA/CA/B.Sc. IT students can go for industrial training for partial fulfillment of their project thesis.

#### 4.3 Debates/Seminars

The committee conducts debates, seminars, workshops, drama, Science Exhibitions, Painting competitions etc. for students.

#### 4.4 NCC

The college has NCC Coy. Its activities are aimed at unity, discipline, cultural norms and collaborative attitude. The students participate in march-past, drill, first aid, firing, trekking and national integration camps. The best of the cadets are

provided opportunity to participate in Independence/Republic Day parades in the national capital and are provided with scholarships. They also have reserved quota in admissions to prestigious institution and jobs throughout the country.

#### 4.5 NSS

For rendering social services, the college has three NSS units comprising of 300 volunteers. The units are looked after by three NSS Program Officers. The NSS volunteers carry out activities of social utility such as environmental awareness programmes, Blood donation camps, cleanliness drives, anti-tobacco awareness programmes and the like.

##### 4.5.1 Red Ribbon Club (NSS Group)

The college NSS group stands registered member of Red Ribbon Club which works under the banner of J&K AIDS Control and Prevention Society for AIDS free society.

##### 4.5.2 Road Safety Club

The group conducts awareness programmes regarding road safety.

##### 4.5.3 Green Club

The club conducts awareness programmes regarding preservation of environment.

#### 4.6 Digital Classrooms

Classrooms have been digitally enabled with the modern ICT tools.



### 5.1 Class Rooms

The college has about 40 classrooms to impart quality education and is constantly upgrading and extending the facility. Construction of multiple class room blocks is in final phase. Also, a multi-storey science block is under construction and is expected to be completed by the end of Academic session 2019-20.

### 5.2 Laboratories

The college has science laboratories equipped with latest instruments for carrying out practical work. Computer laboratories for Computer Applications, BCA, B.Sc. IT, BBA, BMMMC, Geography, Statistics, Electronics & Commerce students are equipped with latest Computers.

### 5.3 Library

The college has a state-of-art central library, housed in a multi-storey fire safe building fully automated and equipped with Surveillance and Intercom Systems. It has a rich collection of about **59,221** Text Books on different subjects. In addition the library has a Reference Section with **3,357** volumes, Best Seller Corner and lifelong subscription to N-List (online journals).

### 5.4 Reading Room

The college has a spacious reading room with a capacity of 100 seats. The reading room has subscription to a large number of magazines, journals, periodicals, newsletters; and local and national dailies.

### 5.5 Browsing Centre

Housed in the library block is a spacious Browsing Centre for internet access. It is equipped with 30 systems with 24x7 internet connectivity.

### 5.6 Language Lab

The college has a Language Lab in 1st Floor of library block which is operated by the Department of English.

### 5.7 Botanic & Herbal Gardens

The college has gardens for carrying out experimental & research work in courses like Botany, Biotechnology, Seed Technology, Environmental Science and allied subjects.

### 5.8 Girls' Park

The college has a separate park for girl students in front of the administrative block.

### 5.9 Smart Class Rooms

The college has multiple Smart Class Room facilities equipped with ICT tools that augment teaching-learning process. The facilities are available in the department of Computer Applications, Physics, Biotechnology. These facilities are shared for optimum utilization and for maximum benefit of students.

### 5.10 Audio Visual Centre

The college has a spacious and well equipped Audio Visual Centre (AVC) where special inter-disciplinary lectures by renowned subject experts are arranged for both students and faculty throughout the academic session. The weekly schedule of such lectures is published well in advance.

### 5.11 EduSat

The J&K Higher Education Department has been operating the EduSat facility to facilitate delivery of lectures (live/recorded) of renowned experts remotely, from anywhere in the country, to the students and faculty.

### 5.12 Advanced Research Centre

Advanced Research Centre has been established in Chemistry Department with all research facilities to carry out research work in Life Chemical Sciences.

### 5.13 OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)

The college library is fully automated. The students can inquire the status/location and availability of a book from the terminals installed in the corridor of the library block.

### 5.14 Website

The Department of Computer Applications of the college operates & maintains a website <http://www.gdcboysang.ac.in/>. It is updated regularly and all the information pertaining to students and other stakeholders is always available on the website.

**5.16 Android App**

The college has developed an Android Application for better and swift communication of information like Notifications, News, Course Material, to the students from anywhere. The app [\*\*\*GDC Anantnag Official\*\*\*](#) can be downloaded from Play Store.

**5.17 Auditorium**

The college has a state—of—art Auditorium of five hundred seating capacity where seminars, conferences, workshops, debates, dramas, and extension activities are held.

**5.18 Conference Hall**

The college has a Conference Hall with a seating capacity of 100. The hall is mainly used for meetings and extension lectures.

**5.19 J&K Bank ATM**

The J&K Bank Ltd. operates an ATM inside the college premises which is available 24x7.

**5.20 Residential/Hostel Facility**

The college has residential facility for about 250 students. Facilities like DTH for the recreation, Aqua guards for pure and safe drinking water, electric geysers for hot water in washrooms, Wi-Fi for internet access are made available to the hostellers. The college has installed a Solar Energy Unit for augmenting the electricity supply in collaboration from JKEDI, Government of Jammu & Kashmir.

The contributory mess is run by the hostellers themselves under the supervision of hostel warden.

**5.21 First Aid/Health Centre**

The college runs a medical centre under a trained Medical Assistant of J&K Health Department meant for providing first aid to the students and faculty. In addition the college organizes general health checkup programs for its students and staff on a quarterly basis.

**5.22 Canteen**

The college runs a canteen on contract basis on competitive rates. The Canteen committee

encourages student feedback for quality canteen services.

**5.23 Drinking Water**

The college has created a centralized facility for pure and safe drinking water for the students. Pure and safe drinking water is also available in the campus at various points in the institution where water purifiers are installed.

**5.24 Washrooms**

The college has sufficient number of washrooms for students in the departments and at various places adjacent to classrooms and laboratories in the campus.

**5.25 Sports Infrastructure**

The college has latest equipment for both indoor as well as out door games. The college has a vast & beautiful playground for games like Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Hockey, Badminton & Kabbadi. The college has a Mechanized Pitch Roller for maintaining the ground. The college has a state-of-the-art Gym with latest equipment for the benefit of the students.

**5.26 Car/Scooter Parking**

The college has a parking lot for car parking to the right side of the Main Gate and scooter parking space behind Administrative block.

**5.27 Continuous Power Supply**

The college has a Genset for power backup which supplies power to vital installations like Administration block, Computer labs, Mini Press. The Computer Application Department has 30 KVA Servo Stabilizer & UPS facilities with a cumulative power backup of 20KVA.

**5.28 Mini Press**

The college has a mini press for printing various publications like newsletters, magazines and prospectus, fliers etc.

**5.29 Surveillance**

The college has installed twenty five CCTV cameras for 24x7 surveillance.

### 6.1 University Intranet

The IT & SS section is connected to university intranet through RF link. The facility is run by a dedicated IT professional deputed by the affiliating university. The centre provides a helping hand to the students regarding admission, registration, examination and evaluation process of the university.

### 6.2 Grievance Redressal Cell

The cell has been established to redress grievances of the students.

### 6.3 Women Development Cell

The college has a cell for Girl students which ensures their maximum participation in curricular, co/extra-curricular activities, for their holistic development in academic and allied fields. It conducts women-centric programs. Besides, it redresses grievances of the girl students, female staff and faculty of the college.

### 6.4 Anti-Eve Teasing Committee

The committee ensures that girl students and female staff feel safe and comfortable while being on campus. Any unlikely incident of eve teasing may be reported to the committee.

### 6.5 Girls' Common Room

The college has a separate room for female students in the college.

### 6.6 Financial Aid

The socially & economically weak students are provided with financial support by the college and other J&K and national agencies. The Student Welfare Fund of the college, *Post-Matric Scholarship* of the Social Welfare Department, *Bad Pockets Scholarship* of the Higher Education Department and the UGC Assistance to the students belonging to SC/ST, minority and BPL categories are some of the welfare schemes for the socially and economically disadvantaged students of the college.

### 6.7 College Publications

To encourage the writers among the staff and the students, the college publishes an annual magazine "**Verinag**". It provides an opportunity for the emerging talents to express themselves. This magazine has proved as an initial launching forum for various renowned writers. A bi-annual newsletter by the same name "**Verinag**" is also being published by the college. The newsletter covers institutional activities carried out by the students and the staff. Also, the department of Mass Communication and Journalism publishes a monthly tabloid "**The Illustrator**".

### 6.8 College Conveyance

The college has a 32 seater bus and a 7 seater SUV for ferrying students to various field tours and subject

tours. These vehicles are also used for ferrying participants for various sports activities.

### 6.9 IGNOU Study Centre 1211

The college runs the largest study centre of the IGNOU in North India.; which has proven instrumental in our student progression over the years.

### 6.10 Xerox Facility

The college provides xerox facility for the students at reasonable rates in the Administrative block.

### 6.11 Career Counseling Cell

The college has established a guidance cell which provides counseling to the students for exploring career & higher education options. The cell explores possibilities of opportunities and promotes useful career planning. In collaboration with various Govt. and Non-Govt. agencies like Udaan, JKEDI, the college provides training and placement assistance to its students.

### 6.12 RUSA Courses

The college runs two job oriented skill courses: **Domestic Data Entry and Tourism & Hospitality** (Travel Consultant), under RUSA initiated by the MHRD and is being monitored by Central Project Appraisal Board.

### 6.13 WiFi:

The students can use the free WiFi service available in the college campus.

### 6.14 Smart Card

The students are issued the smart card for accessing various resources in the Central Library.

### 6.15 Anti-Ragging Committee

Ragging has been banned by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and it is therefore strictly prohibited in the college premises. The committee ensures no such incident happens on the campus.

### 6.16 Notice Boards

The college updates the notice boards on regular basis for the benefit of the students. In addition to the conventional notice boards, the college has two electronic notice boards: one in Girls' Park & another at the library gate.

### 6.17 Alumni Association: Kahkashan

After a student successfully completes the Programme of study, the college tracks his/her career progression. 6. It is mandatory for every student to attend at least 75% of the theory/tutorials/practicals delivered; otherwise he/she will not be allowed to appear in the Semester End Examination.
7. If a student remains absent from the class for at least 10 consecutive days his/her name will be struck off from the college rolls.
8. Fees, funds/dues once paid shall not be refundable, transferable or adjustable under any circumstances.
9. If a student is found to have fraudulently got admission in the college by submitting wrong/incomplete information he/she shall be removed from the college and he/she shall forfeit the claim to refund of all fees and other dues paid. The college may take further action it may deem fit against the said student and his/her guardian.
10. The students must park their vehicles in the parking space designated for them, only.
11. The students must use only the designated space in the college canteen.
12. Ragging within the college premises is strictly prohibited. Any student found indulging in such practice shall be subject to strict disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from the college and shall be liable to pay fine.
13. Plucking of flowers or harming the green zones and tiny herbs or violating animal rights on the college campus is strictly prohibited. Any student involved in such activities shall be liable to pay fine.
14. Keeping/carrying mobile phones in the college campus is prohibited.

16. Damaging college property in any way is prohibited. Any student involved in such activities shall be liable to strict disciplinary action under rules.
