The OMR as part of semester end exam under CBCS was introduced by University of Kashmir for UG programmes for the first time in 2016. As the students were not fully acquainted with this pattern of exam, a lot of students who appeared in the said exam made silly mistakes in filling the roll nos, course codes and series of question booklets on their respected OMR sheets that resulted in discrepancies during declaration of their results which were shown as LO/NA/Reappear etc. The college administration received applications from the aggrieved students and accordingly sought redressal from the affiliating university on case to case basis.

Research exposure is also provided to the students.
